Section 1 Registrant's Business and Operations

Item 1.01 Entry into a Material Definitive Agreement.

On July 26, 2016, Allegiant Air, LLC, a subsidiary of Allegiant Travel Company (the "Company") entered into agreements with Airbus S.A.S. ("Airbus") and CFM International Inc. ("CFM") to acquire twelve (12) newly manufactured CFM-powered A320ceo aircraft for scheduled deliveries beginning in 2017 and ending in 2018.

The list price for the aircraft is approximately \$1.2 billion with the prices subject to discounts and price escalations through the dates of delivery.

The foregoing description does not purport to be complete and is qualified in its entirety by reference to the definitive agreements, which the Company intends to file as exhibits to the Company's Quarterly Report on Form 10-Q for the quarter ending September 30, 2016.
